Ways Your Club Can Serve



Food Drive

Purpose: Collect food for families experiencing hunger in your community.

What You'll Do: Host a food drive at your school, neighborhood, or church and donate the items to a local food bank or pantry.

Impact: Food drives provide meals for families and individuals facing food insecurity.



Meal Packing

Purpose: Prepare meals that can be distributed to people experiencing hunger.

What You'll Do: Partner with a local nonprofit or organize a meal-packing event where volunteers assemble nutritious meals.

Impact: Meal-packing events can provide hundreds or even thousands of meals in a single day.



Community Garden

Purpose: Supply fresh food to support local hunger relief programs.

What You'll Do: Volunteer at a community garden or plant a small garden at your school. Harvested produce can be donated to food pantries or community kitchens.

Impact: Fresh fruits and vegetables help improve nutrition for families facing hunger.



Awareness Campaign

Purpose: Help others understand hunger and food insecurity and how they can help.

What You'll Do:

- Host a Hunger Awareness Week
- Share hunger facts and stories
- Promote service opportunities
- Invite classmates to volunteer

Impact: Education inspires others to take action and support hunger relief efforts

- Choose a service project your club would like to organize.
- Work with your school leaders to plan the activity.
- Invite friends and community members to join the effort.
