In a world filled with noise and fast-paced digital communication, a personal letter carries a unique and powerful impact. Letter writing campaigns remind us that our words have the power to uplift, influence, inspire, and support those who may feel forgotten or need a smile.

We suggest that you use your school's return address (not a personal return address), your first name only when signing, and no contact information on the letters you write.

1. Write Letters of Thanks to Your School Community



- Purpose:** Surprise those you see around campus, administrators, cafeteria workers, bus drivers, teachers, coaches, and support staff with heartfelt letters of appreciation and thanks for all they do, and drop them off once completed.
- Inspiration:** Consider writing about how they've made a difference, helped you feel safe, or inspired you. A few kind words can go a long way.

2. Letters Against Isolation



- Purpose:** Write letters to isolated seniors in care homes to combat loneliness. They provide clear guidelines, example letters, and have a sign up process for more information on their website.
